Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is:

An opportunity for you to have fresh produce through the growing season while supporting your local small farmers. As a bonus, you get to taste new vegetables while "eating with the season."

Community Supported Agriculture is an arrangement between a farmer and local consumers to share the risks and bounty of the growing season. A CSA farm sells shares before each growing season begins and then provides a weekly bag of freshly harvested food for their shareholders throughout the season.

Six local family owned farms support the effort of this CSA. You are encouraged to visit the farms and talk to the farmers whenever you have questions.

How much is it?

Each share is \$195.00. This is a cost of \$15.00 per week for the 13 weeks of the project.

Half shares are available for \$100.00.
